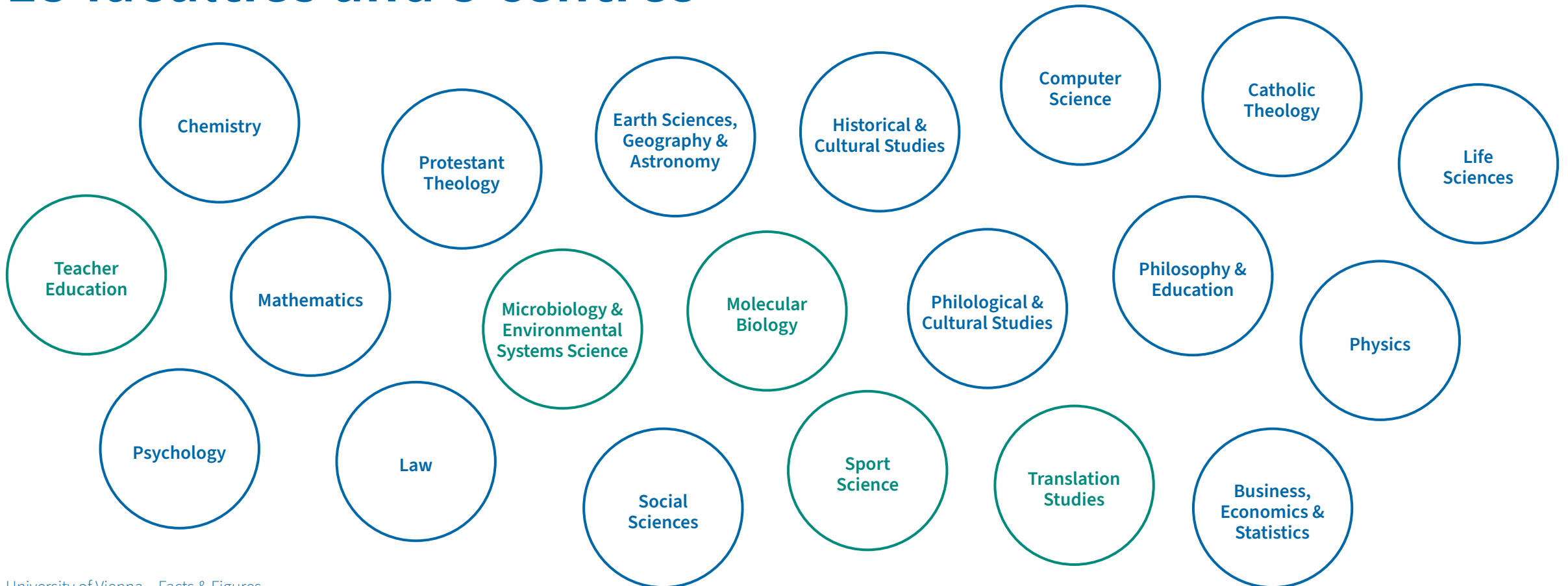


A university steeped in history and knowledge creator of a global city

- Founded by Duke Rudolph IV in 1365 as the **Alma Mater Rudolphina Vindobonensis**
- One of the oldest and largest universities in Europe
- Opening of the historic Main Building of the University in the heart of Vienna's city centre in 1884
- More than 60 locations in Vienna
- Host of more than 1,000 events and 350 international conferences

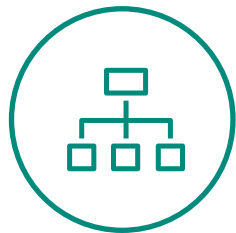


Diversity under one roof: 15 faculties and 5 centres

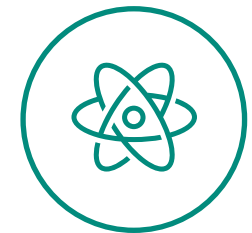

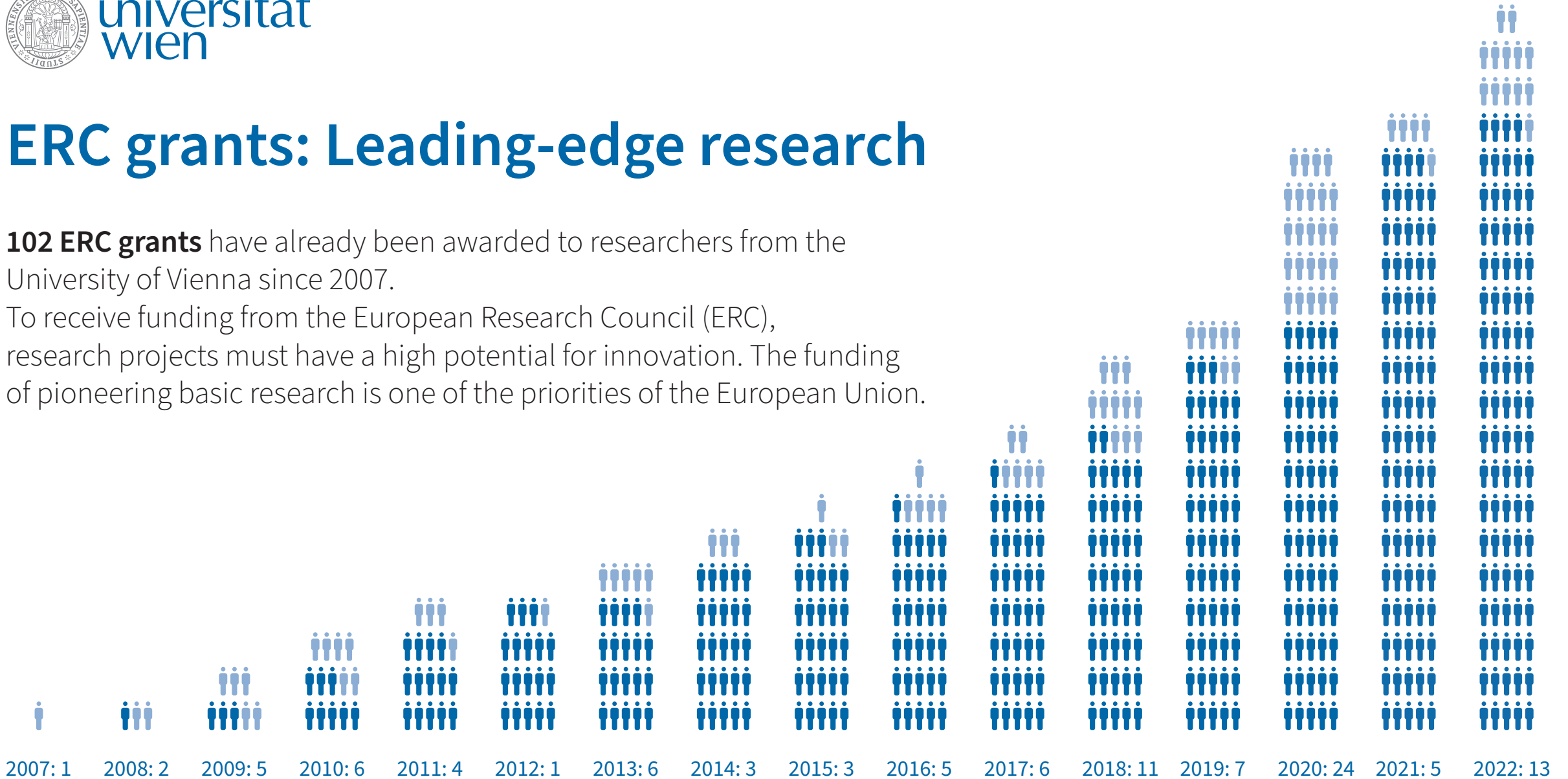

ERC grants: Leading-edge research

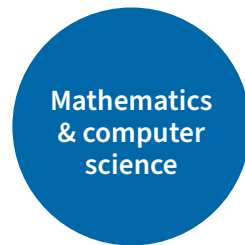
102 ERC grants have already been awarded to researchers from the University of Vienna since 2007.

To receive funding from the European Research Council (ERC), research projects must have a high potential for innovation. The funding of pioneering basic research is one of the priorities of the European Union.



Degree programmes: individual specialisation through a wide range of degree programmes

- There are 1.9 million people living in Vienna, more than 10 % of whom are students from 130 different nations. About 89,000 students are enrolled at the University of Vienna.
- The University of Vienna offers 184 degree programmes (bachelor's, master's, diploma programmes and doctoral programmes).
- Together with cooperating university colleges of teacher education, the University of Vienna is also the largest teacher education institution in Austria. It offers 28 teaching subjects/specialisations.

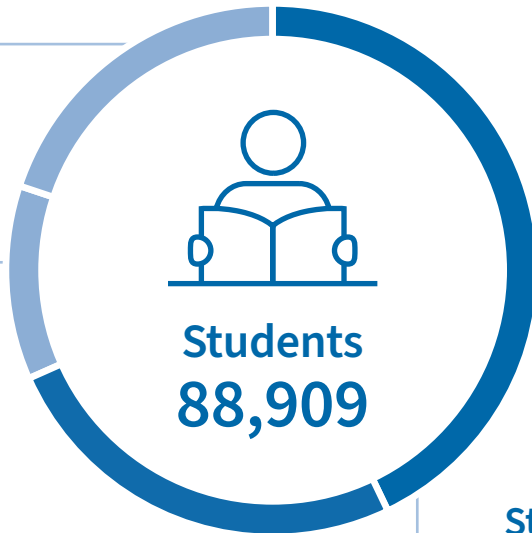

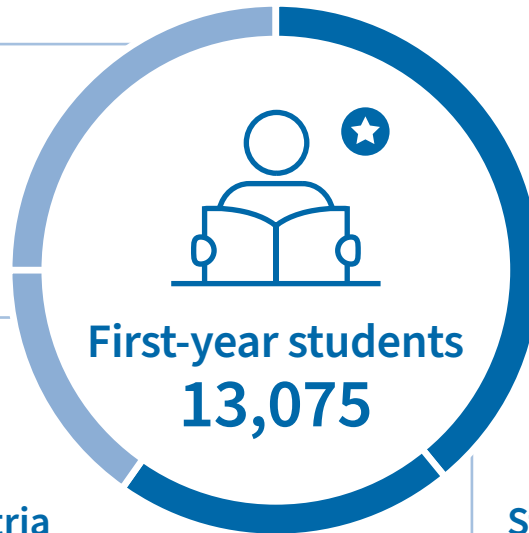

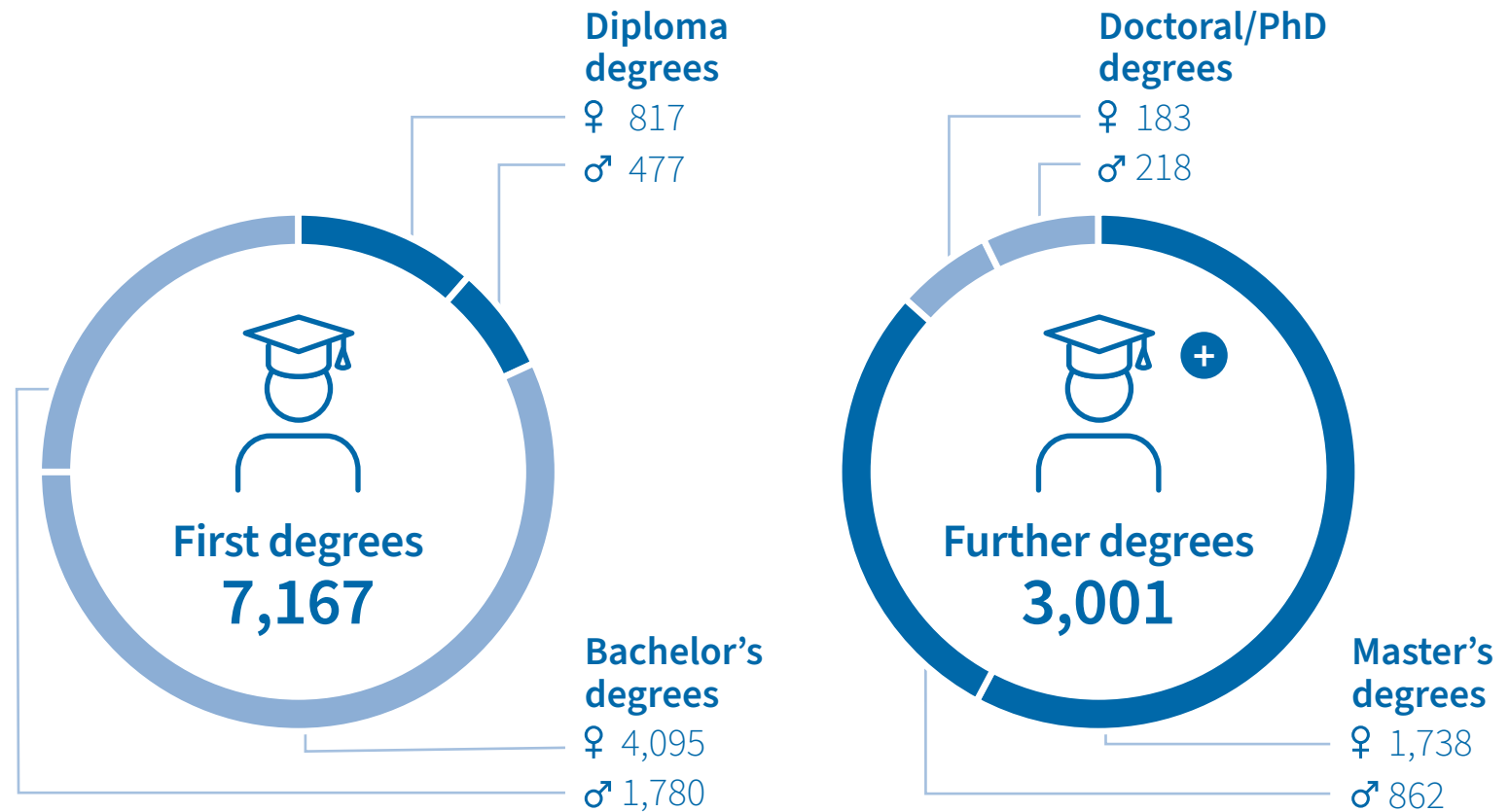

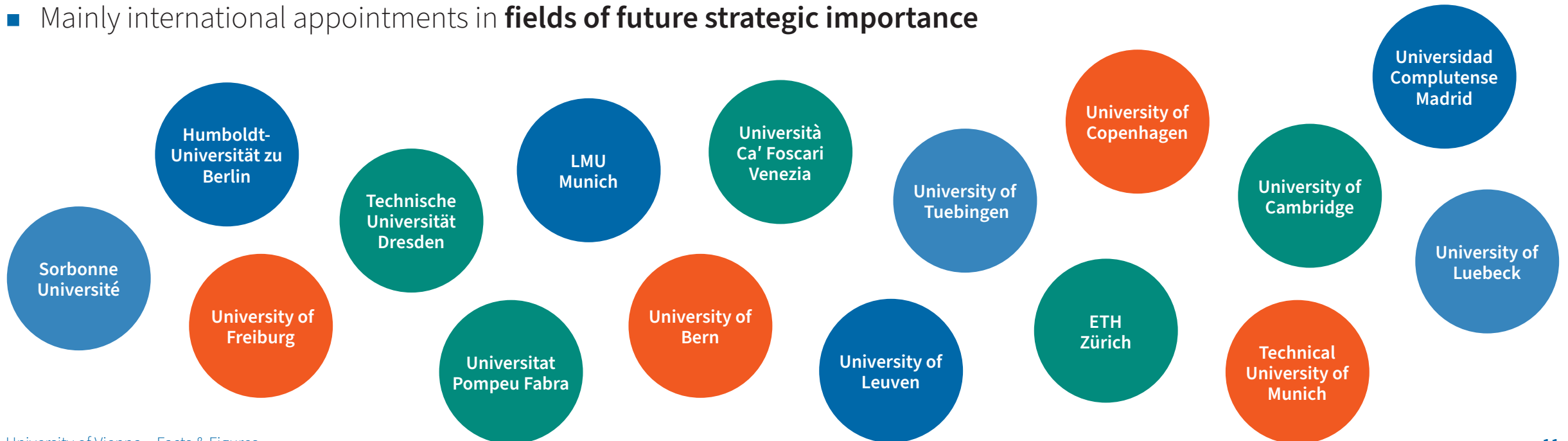

New professorial appointments

- More than 70 new professorships were advertised at the end of 2018
- Since then, additional professorships haven been advertised continuously.
- Qualitative and quantitative investment, biggest expansion of the University of Vienna since its advance in the second half of the 19th century
- Mainly international appointments in **fields of future strategic importance**

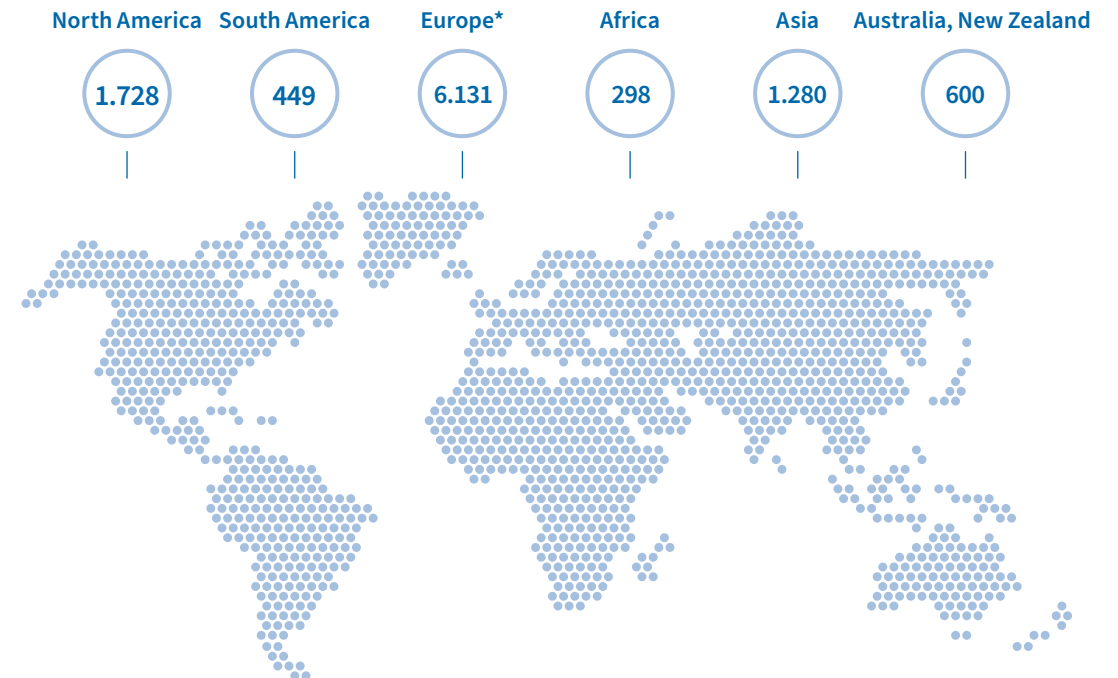
- University-wide partnership agreements: about 80

International publication collaborations 2019–2021



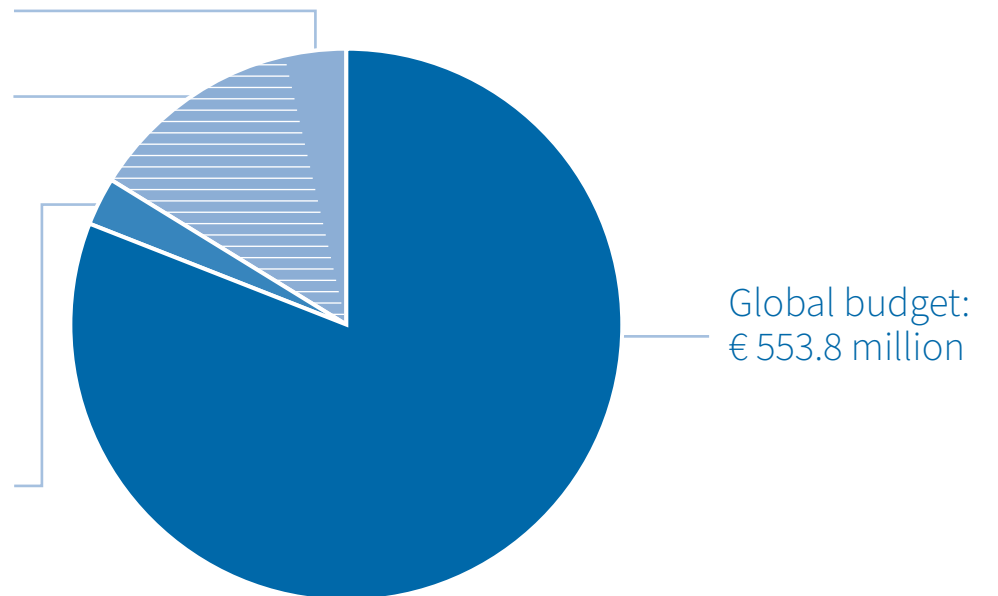

University revenues 1 January 2020–31 December 2021

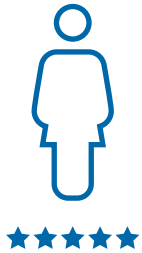

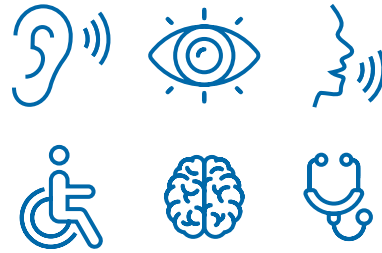

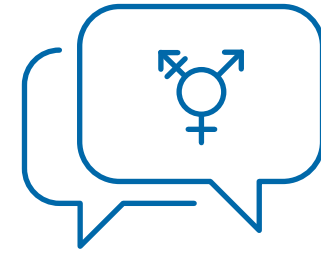
Diversity in numbers

The **Accessible Studying team** advises prospective students, students and professors on studying with impairments.

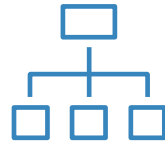


The University of Vienna is committed to the use of **gender-inclusive language** and has issued guidelines on this particular topic.
